



This week Nursery have been thinking about the story 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'. They have been very creative making caterpillars out of playdough and creating symmetrical butterflies using paint.





This week the pupils in RW have been reading the traditional tale, 'The Three Little Pigs and the Big Bad Wolf'. They have been building houses in the construction area using different materials and have tested which houses could not be huffed and puffed down.



This week Year 1 read Beegu by Alexis Deacon. We were very shocked to find an egg which hatched during the week into an alien, Quooz! The pupils have created their own adventures for Quooz as he travels back to his home planet, Pandora, and goes exploring.



This week 1B have been exploring plants in their science lessons. The pupils used their observation skills to explore and identify the different parts of a plant. 1B also planted radish seeds to observe the growth of plants.



Year 2 had a fantastic visit at the Sikh Gurdwara this week where they consolidated their learning in RE about prayer and worship. We visited the prayer hall where Sikhs come together to meet, sing, and pray. Pupils enjoyed a warm welcome and a delicious snack!



Year 2B really enjoyed creating reversible art this week with the resident artists. They looked at how to create a fruit bowl, but if you arrange the fruit carefully, when you turn the bowl upside down, it creates a person wearing a hat!




This week, 3M had great fun exploring the song 'The Bare Necessities' from the Disney film 'The Jungle Book' in their Comprehension lesson. Pupils had an interesting discussion about the meaning behind the entertaining lyrics and they finished the session by contemplating what their 'bare necessities' of life are. They mostly found that they were very different to those described by Baloo the Bear in the song!



As part of their Science topic of light, pupils in 3S discussed how and why the sun is dangerous for their eyes and explored the different ways they can be protected. Pupils then looked at the different materials used to make sunglasses and even designed their own pair ready for summer!

Year 4W have produced some beautiful writing this week in response to our English text 'The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane.' The pupils wrote from the perspective of the toy rabbit named Edward writing to his previous owner, Abilene, and developed some incredibly emotive sentences using sophisticated adjectives and vocabulary.



Year 5's highlight this week came in science. The pupils continue to explore 'biomimicry' and delve deeper into how designs in nature can help humanity. This week, we specifically focussed on what we can learn from birds! They discovered how we can draw inspiration for flying from the peregrine falcon, geese and the barn owl. They then honed in on one of these birds each and did some amazing research. We now have some aviation experts!



5B have been reading The Adventures of Odysseus in English and have started to create their own chapter of the story containing their own monster. They modelled our narrative on the story of Odysseus defeating the cyclops. They had great fun drawing and designing our monsters and presenting them to our table groups.

This week, Year 6 have been reading some National Geographic non-chronological reports about deadly insects in preparation for writing their own about the Yellow-Spotted Lizard featuring in Louis' Sachar's Holes. We had an in-depth conversation about the poisonous lizard's appearance, habitat and method of hunting for food and the pupils are very excited to write theirs in a few days.
