
This week pupils in our 3B were learning with our resident artists. They used a variety of methods to create botanical diagrams inspired by the work of Maria Sibylla Merian- one of the first naturalists to study insects and botany. Have a look at their marvellous recreations of chestnuts and leaves.



This week pupils in our Nursery have been thinking carefully about how they can look after the plants in their Nursery garden. Pupils have enjoyed using the watering cans to water the herbs and strawberries in their flower beds.

Pupils in RB were very excited this week to meet our chicks and spend a day with them. They had to keep them clean and make sure they had enough food and water. Everyone got to touch or hold the chicks. It was wonderful to hear the descriptive language being used about how the chicks felt. Pupils had to be very careful not to hurt the delicate chicks but it was very funny when one ran around the carpet and Mrs Hatcher couldn't catch it – she did eventually though.

In RW, pupils have been learning about animals and habitats. They painted beautiful sunsets by blending red, orange and yellow paint together, then drew and cut out an animal silhouette to stick on top. They look fantastic on the wall.



Pupils in Year 2 explored the features of persuasion in their writing this week in the context of our 'Alternative versions of Traditional Tales' unit in English. They practiced their persuasive arguments in role play as the Big Bad Wolf trying to convince the police that they were innocent and that the houses had 'accidentally' been blown away by some giant sneezing! A lot of giggling was heard in the Year 2 classroom this week. Year 2 also really enjoyed the Clean Air Day assembly and discussions around what actions can be taken to tackle air pollution, and really enjoyed their outdoor reading session in the shade!

During Mathematics, pupils in 3M have been learning all about angles and shapes. Pupils made their own 'right angle testers' and then undertook a quest around the classroom to see how many they could identify. They came to the conclusion that there are many right angles all around us.

This week, pupils in 4A have been leaning more about the Tudors and the life of Henry VIII. Pupils investigated how reliable different sources were before studying different portraits of the King to identify, and discuss, what they could infer from each portrait.



Pupils in our Year 6 class have been delving into their new topic of this term: Biodiversity. They watched a documentary last week as part of their research into the past, present and future threats to our environment and its stability. Pupils have used the WWF Living Planet Report (Youth Edition) to look into the pressing threats facing our planet today.

We wish our 6B pupils a wonderful trip to Normandie next week.



The preparations for Sports Day have been ramping up with the focus this week being on running. In KS1 pupils worked on changes of speed before doing some team relays and some fun races. In KS2, pupils focused on their reactions as well as using sprint set ups. We are all very excited for the competition on the 3rd and 4th of July and we hope to see you all there.
