Reception pupils are also settling so well to BWA. It is such a treat to see them come into school smiling every day and so engaged throughout the day.



In literacy they have been reading one of my favourite books, Owl Babies and making puppets to retell the story with their friends. 2B have had a fantastic week of learning. In Geography, they have used atlases to find cities and countries in both the United Kingdom and France. It was great to use a real atlas to support our learning in class.





2G have been practising being Super Scientists by using their research skills. They have been finding information about foxes and snails to write information booklets using chrome books and non-fiction texts.



In their science lessons, 3M have been discussing which animals are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. They have enjoyed sharing their extensive knowledge about what different animals eat and discovering what nutrients their diets provide. A highlight of the week for year 4 has been observing the effect that different liquids (Coca-Cola, tea and coffee) have on egg shells in an investigation to reflect the impact that they have on our teeth. I think we could all learn from the results from their experiment.



In 6B, the pupils have been learning about the circulatory system in Science. This week, the class completed a dissection of a lamb's heart to further develop their understanding of how blood is pumped around the body.

love BHM and look forward to learning more this month with the pupils and staff. Wandsworth are also organising many events that families may like to explore. Click here for a list of the events.




#### **Parent Governor Elections**
