BWA Book Fair - 10th, 13th, 14th, 15th November



Times Tables Workshop for Year 3 & 4 families - *Understanding the year 4 'Multiplication Tables Check' and supporting your children in learning their 'times tables'*.

Having quick recall of times tables facts gives children a solid foundation in mathematics that will help them work out a variety of calculations easily and quickly. Knowing times tables facts provides the building blocks for understanding higher learning, such as long multiplication, long division, fractions and fraction of numbers, algebra and solving word problems.

To help parents with strategies to support children learning their times tables and in understanding the Year 4, MTC we are offered a virtual 'workshop' on Tuesday. Sincere thanks to everyone who joined one of the sessions.



On Thursday we held an Open Morning for prospective families and we loved showcasing the wonderful provision at BWA. Here are some of our highlights from learning together this week.



Year 5 loved their learning with our Resident Artists this week. They explored the traditional theme of still life, drawing inspiration from the modernist work of Paul Cezanne. Pupils were immersed in their learning about the impressionist movement. Drawing inspiration from this, they created their own still life creations based on fruit and classroom objects. Starting in their sketch books, pupils used oil pastels to draw real-life fruit, taking a closer look at Cezanne's technique, colour scheme, and positioning. Their final paintings even had an added three-dimensional effect as the objects were suspended on the canvas using string. The outcomes were incredible.



For Anti-Bullying Week, Nursery have been learning about how a superhero's true power is kindness. We are very good at being kind in Nursery so we celebrated by making our very own superhero masks and capes that we painted our first name initials onto. Kindness really is a super power!



This week in RW we have been learning about Nocturnal Animals. Pupils have enjoyed using mixed media to create collages of owls, hedgehogs, badgers, bats and cats. These lovely photographs show our pupils really concentrating on getting the technique and detail right as they use paint and paper to create their collage hedgehogs.



Pupils in Year 1 have been looking at vowel digraphs. They have shown fantastic sounding and blending skills and are even beginning to articulate the rule: when two vowels go walking, the first one does the talking. A great effort to learn some new graphemes, well done Year 1.

In 1B we were learning about fact families in Maths. The students really impressed Mrs Brouwer by showing their understanding of the inverse relationship between addition and subtraction. They consolidated this by writing a range of equations. Well done 1B!



Year 2 have had a lot of fun during the launch of their English unit on Michael Rosen. They have loved listening to and performing 'Chocolate Cake', which inspired their writing as they wrote fabulous recounts this week, using conjunctions and exciting adjectives.

In Year 3, pupils have been exploring their new book "George Speaks". They were asked to create predictions about what might happen next in the story and used dialogue to create a conversation between George and the doctor. They then performed their dialogues with their partners to the rest of the class with so much confidence.



During their English week, pupils in 4B have been eagerly creating and describing a creature using expanded noun phrases, with prepositional phrases, for their FOUND posters. This writing was inspired by the many lost creatures from The Lost Thing story by Shaun Tan.

In our English stream, pupils in Year 4 have been working hard to practice their multiplication skills, looking at the 6, 7, 9, 11 and 12s. Every day they challenge ourselves to complete them in a better time. We are very proud that pupils are able to answer a question in less than 3 seconds.

5B have enjoyed their learning during their R.E.W unit - 'Why do you judge me?' and have created posters celebrating difference and diversity. This week they have discussed the terms prejudice and discrimination and their link to stereotyping. Pupils have also considered how it feels to be on the receiving end of discrimination and developed their empathy surrounding the treatment of others.

During their English lessons this week, pupils in Year 6 have continued reading, 'The Longest Night of Charlie Noon' by Christopher Edge, investigating how the author creates tension and atmosphere throughout the narrative. They used their investigation skills to decode a hidden message within the book. They can't wait to read on to discover what the message (the way forward is the way back) really means.

This week nine boys from Year 5 and 6 went to Southfields Academy to compete in the EFL Cup which is a knockout tournament with group stages. The top 2 teams from each group then advance to the knockout round. The winners of the day would then have a chance to play at Wembley Stadium if they won the next tournament.

Our boys finished 2nd in their group with 2 wins and 1 loss, which meant we moved on to the knockout stage. Unfortunately we lost that match to but ended up finishing 5th out of 19 teams. It was an incredible effort by our BWA pupils, especially as the rain tumbled down. We are so proud and cannot wait for another chance to play together. Lastly, thank you to our parent helper Gianfranco. He was a fantastic second in command and really helped coach and support the boys.



Information on Measles / MMR vaccination – message from the NHS

Measles cases are rising across the country, with over 102,000 children starting primary school in England being at risk of catching the disease. We are asking education settings to share key messages from the NHS about MMR / measles and how to get vaccinated.

Measles is highly infectious and if left unvaccinated nine out of ten children in a classroom can catch the disease if just one child is infectious.
