This week pupils in our Nursery have been practising their fine motor skills by using the tweezers to hunt for mini beasts.

This the week pupils in RW have been collecting petals and leaves. They have arranged these beautifully onto a thin piece of card and pressed them inside a book for several days. It has created a beautiful flower

press bookmark that they can take into Year 1.

This week Year 1 went to the Holly Lodge Centre to experience a Victorian school day. They travelled back in time to 1869, where they completed Reading, Writing and Arithmetic lessons. Pupils got to see the different types of punishment used in Victorian classrooms such as finger cuffs, backboards and Dunce's hats. The day finished with a drill lesson and fun game of coordination using soft blocks. A huge thank you to all the parents that volunteered their time to help as well as Miss Williams and Miss Sockalingam for organising the experience.



This week, 1B showed their creative writing skills by writing their own version of the story Jack and the Beanstalk. They used exciting words and interesting adjectives to describe the setting and characters.



Year 2 pupils had another busy week! They planted their plants, which they grew from seeds last term, in the outdoor area, with the help and expertise from Mr Crane and Mrs Callam. Pupils were able to taste some mint and strawberries as well as enjoy planting and watering. Thanks to our fantastic parent helpers for running this gardening session for us



2M worked very hard with our resident artists – as you can see from this picture. They made a printing and collage-based fruit and vegetable work of art in the style of Guiseppe Arcimboldo.

In Year 3S this week, pupils have been writing their own Lonely Planet Guides. Everyone had the chance to choose their own Mediterranean country to research. Pupils explored the

attractions, food, weather and interesting facts about their chosen country and have produced fantastic outcomes.



This week in mathematics, 3M have been learning all about angles. Pupils made their own 'right angle testers' and then undertook a quest around the classroom to see how many they could identify. They came to the conclusion that there are right angles all around us.

A highlight for Year 4 this week has been revisiting their unit of 'Shackleton's Journey' through discovering how conservationists and archaeologists are currently trying to preserve the recently discovered wreck of 'Endurance' which was found 3,000m below the surface of the Weddell Sea. The class found the BBC article extremely interesting and were fascinated by its preservation after over 100 years of it sinking.





4B have been keen learners of history this week whilst exploring the function of Motte and Bailey Castles as well as the equipment and training required to be a knight during the Norman Conquest. Excellent questions and discussions were had about the pros and cons of castle design as well.

Over the past two weeks, Year 5 have enjoyed their intensive swimming course with Year 4. They have all made excellent progress. Not only have they been learning how to swim, they have also learnt about water safety; how to keep themselves safe if they get into trouble; and how to help others who may have fallen into water.



This week in Year 6, we have been putting the final touches on our science projects. The pupils have written their letters to their chosen audience, created their presentation and campaign poster. I have now tasked them with creating a short, emotive film for their chosen area and a website where people can find out more information. The pupils will begin practising their presentation to perform in front of the class. It has been brilliant to see them use their ICT skills to create their project.
