This week, pupils in our wonderful Nursery have enjoyed listening to the story, 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea'. They have been using their fantastic drawing skills to draw their own tigers. We have all been so impressed with the details our pupils included in their drawings.



Pupils in RW have been learning about traditional tales. To enhance their understanding of these tales, they were very fortunate to have the opportunity to see Jack v Giant at the Polka Theatre. The show was fantastic and everyone enjoyed the performance. Thank you to all the adults who worked so hard to make this trip happen.

Year 1 have been working really hard on sharing objects out equally this week. They've been working with their partners and using cubes to show the security of their understanding. They are making super progress in maths.

Pupils in 2B have been reading Mae Among the Stars - a true story about Dr Mae Jemison, first African American female astronaut for NASA. After reading this incredible book, pupils wrote a diary entry about how little Mae felt on the day that her teacher told her that maybe she should be a nurse instead of an astronaut. Their favourite part of this book was when Mae's mum told her, "If you can dream it, if you can believe in it, and if you work hard for it, anything is possible."



Year 2 had a brilliant start to the week and particularly enjoyed their gardening session with Mr Crane. They got the chance to identify and smell various herbs in our garden development as well as plant beans and coriander ahead of their next topic in science about plants. It was a wonderful morning of leaning about nature and our environment.



On Wednesday, pupils in 3M had an amazing day immersed in plants. They too had a session with Mr Crane, one of our parents and gardening extraordinaire and in the afternoon they visited Streatham Common Community Garden.



During their morning session outside in our garden development, pupils planted French beans, peas and coriander with Mr Crane. It was wonderful to see them applying their new scientific and geographical knowledge when sowing more seeds and learning about other plants in the community garden. To top it off, the sun even made an appearance whilst they were having lunch in the orchard!

Pupils in 3S have been busy learning what shadows are. They carried out their own investigations to change the size and shape of a shadow. Pupils discovered that by changing the distance between the light source and the object meant the size and shape of shadow changed. We do love science at BWA!



Year 5 have been solving problems using their new knowledge about percentages. We have been very pleased to see how well they approach the problems before deciding on the method they need to use. Pupils have relied on their previous learning about fractions and decimals, to help them.

This week, Year 6 have been writing an origin story about the infamous outlaw, Kissin' Kate Barlow. They have been exploring the character of Katherine, as well as her life as a schoolteacher before she experienced a personal tragedy. Pupils considered the gravity of this tragedy in defining her actions later on in her life and have written some incredible openings to their narratives to help the reader be compassionate and understanding.

Internationally renowned American Artist, the Fabulous, Vicki Sawyer is presenting an online Easter Eggstravaganza Family and Friends Workshop, where both adults and children can come together and create with Vicki. She will be joining in live from her studio in America to take us through her step by step process. Explaining her techniques, tips and surprises she uses in her unique whimsical take on birds, animals and wildlife creations.

Vicki will be demonstrating in acrylics, if you don't have them feel free to use pens, coloured pencils, pastel, crayons or any other form of art material. We're so pleased that we can offer this workshop for free to children, thanks to everyone involved, especially Vicki who is giving up her time to facilitate in this workshop. We are kindly asking that if you're able to, please donate for an adult space. All donations received will be used to fund budding students art practice. (Suggested donation £15 for adult)

Vicki's career was established with a degree in art from Penn State University, which led to work in graphic design, handmade doll creation, and professional mural painting. During her mural painting years, she developed a portfolio of hundreds of murals featuring birds, insects, animals, grasses, and wildflowers. Her experience confidently led her to move into canvas painting of the natural world. This switch, made fifteen years ago, marked the beginning of her expansive career as a fine art painter with a growing library of over 2,500 works.
