

We may have had a very busy social calendar but that didn't interrupt the fantastic learning this week at BWA. Here are some of our highlights.

This week our pupils in Nursery have been extremely busy making shopping lists for Tom Bear's birthday. After choosing the food they would like for the party, pupils thought carefully about the initial sound they could hear for each item of food.

In RB, our pupils have been learning about light and dark. They really enjoyed turning all the lights off in the class and using torches to make shadows. Pupils were surprised to learn that you can make the shadow dance by moving the light source into different positions. They have enjoyed exploring the torches ever since by drawing around the shadows of animals in the class and making shadow puppets in our dark den.

In Maths this week, pupils in RW have been learning about positional language. To support this learning, they created their own obstacle courses both inside and outside and labelled each area of the course with the positional language to match. They then completed their courses with great precision. It was impressive to watch.



Pupils in our Year 1 class have been writing letters to persuade people to visit their cafes. They described the fantastic array of food and drink on offer as well as the different activities available. Everyone was very convincing and loved the chance to read their letter to others in the class.

Year 2 pupils had a relaxing and enriching yoga and mindfulness session this week as part of their learning in PSHE on how to manage our feelings. They learnt different yoga poses as well as breathing techniques, and ended the session with time for shavasana (meditation). Thank you to Laura's Yoga club, for such a fabulous session, it is safe to say all pupils felt very relaxed! Namaste.



Pupils in 3S became expert scientists this week. They carried out their own experiments to explore magnetic fields and the different materials magnets can attract through. After completing the experiment, they shared and discussed what they had found out before writing up their results.

In History this week, pupils in 3M enjoyed discovering who lived in Roman Britain. Pupils participated in an activity based on the popular game 'Guess Who?' which involved them asking specific questions to work out which Roman Briton their partner was. From tribesmen to merchants, they were surprised to find out that such a diverse and multicultural range of people inhabited Britain during this interesting period of history. It was a great exercise.

Pupils in Year 4 have been investigating the water cycle and exploring the changing states of the water from a liquid to gas to liquid. They had a go at making their own water cycle in a bag to check in on during the week. Sounds exciting!



Year 5 had a fantastic time in the visiting 'Wonderdome' this week. Pupils were shown a variety of videos and projections, which visualised scientific processes in space, such as the various stages of the Moon, the planets in orbit and the position of Earth in the Solar System. They were also treated to expert astronaut insight into how to function in the International Space Station, including tips for brushing your teeth and eating lunch in outer space. Amazing!



During the month of October, pupils across the whole school completed the TCS schools mini marathon. Pupils ran laps of our sports area for 10 minutes of their PE lessons each week in order to complete the distance of 2.6 miles. Well done to all pupils for their participation and enthusiasm. Their certificates and badges are something they can share with pride at this fantastic chance to show their resilience and perseverance during a challenging task.
