
We are more than half way through the first half term already and I couldn't be happier that our pupils are settled at school and engaged in their learning. Here are some of our highlights from this week.



Developing a love of stories in Nursery

Reception - learning how we use maths in real life

In Maths this week RW have been learning about **length and height**. When they arrived at school on Monday there was a massive tower on their carpet

• they decided Tom, their teddy had built it! They have been making towers for their teddies ensuring the structures are tall enough for them to fit inside. Pupils used cubes, lolly sticks and other resources to measure how tall the structures were.



Learning how we can managing our emotions in Year 1

1B really enjoyed their PSCHE lesson - 'How can we calm down when we are angry?' Pupils acted out scenarios when they might get angry and then suggested what strategies they could use to calm themselves.



Year 2 learning about significant events that happened in the city we live in

2G have been using some excellent writing skills this week in English. We have been creating diary entries as if we were living at the time of the **Great Fire of London in 1666**. We challenged ourselves to use

old fashioned language like "My heart was full of trouble" and "I made myself ready".



<u>Year 3 – Relevant Books</u>

In their English lessons this week, 3M have been reading **'Azzi in Between'**, a tale of a family having to flee their home due to war. Azzi leaves behind everything she knows and loves, most importantly her grandmother. When Azzi and her family arrive in a new, unfamiliar country they must learn a new language and live among strangers. Everything is different for them. Azzi is both resourceful and brave and slowly learns how to adapt to her new life in

a safe country.

Pupils were able to relate the story due to the recent news stories they have seen and heard about. They demonstrated very sympathetic and mature attitudes when engaging in discussion about how the family must feel about their loss and displacement.



5B Science experiment

The excellent learners in 5B enjoyed another rich and rewarding week of learning. During a science lesson, the crackle of excitement in the classroom was palpable as the pupils conducted an experiment in which they investigated how to separate the

solvent and the solid in a salt and water solution. As well as generating much discussion around how evaporation in the wider world could be of use, it was fantastic to see how confidently and comfortably the pupils were using scientific vocabulary in the spoken interactions and class discussions. Well done to the super scientists of 5B.

Yr 6 Art

Last Thursday 6B studied Van Gogh's painting of **'Starry Night'** with our resident artist. Van Gogh was inspired by the view from his window at the Saint-Paul-de-Mausole asylum in Saint-Rémy, in southern France, when painting this picture. 6B learnt how to cut lino to create a print of this picture. I think they have created fabulous masterpieces. Look at the photograph of an example of the work produced and compare it to the original.
