I am sure you will join me in thanking her for her dedication to the pupils at BWA both as a class teacher and most recently as our PE teacher. I know that this is an exciting opportunity for her to travel but also a sad one as she leaves BWA, her family and friends.

We have appointed a great PE teacher, Mr Butler. Mr Butler will be with us for a few days next week so he is ready for a January start, taking over the role from Miss Stevenson. Year 3 and 4W had a great time meeting him a few weeks ago and I am sure he will love being part of the BWA community. I thank you in advance for making him feel welcome.



This week, pupils in our Nursery have enjoyed searching for reindeers in the outdoor provision. They used their mathematical skills to count how many reindeer they could find and circled the matching numeral on their clipboards. It has been amazing to see how much the pupils have loved their Santa's Grotto as well. Miss Malone – you are so talented! Thank you.

In RW, pupils have continued to explore the Solar System. Every pupil made their own planet, using foam and paint to create a marbling effect. They thought carefully about the colours they would need for the planet they were recreating – the finished products look fantastic. They have also been very busy rehearsing for the nativity play next week – which is super exciting.

Pupils in 1T have been reviewing everything they have learned about addition and subtraction this term. They have a really secure understanding of fact families and some even had the chance to teach their peers how to use a part whole model to write number sentences. They were brilliant teachers!



During their time with our resident artists, pupils in 1B explored the seasons and used different mediums to create a season's wheel. They used stencils and watercolour to create a tree, tissue paper to represent the colours of the different season and used cotton buds to dot acrylic paint.

Year 2M got to grips with units of measurements, comparing lengths in centimetres and metres. They thought about which tools would be best to measure different objects or locations. Pupils also enjoyed measuring steps taken with a metre ruler and comparing distances, using the symbols greater than and less than. Great learning.

Pupils in 2B have been working hard too on their double page spreads in History and Science this week. They enjoyed retelling what they learnt this half-term through short pieces of writing and drawing pictures to support their understanding. I even heard them sing London's Burning – which was wonderful.

It seems like Maths has been a focus this week, as Year 3 were busy mastering long division. Even though this was the first time pupils have been introduced to the concept, they applied all the skills learnt during their multiplication and division topic and showed great determination to answer as many questions as possible.

Year 4 have had a great week finishing off the book Iron Man by reporting on the black-bat-dragon-alien invasion in Australia. Pupils interviewed one another in character to practise developing correctly punctuated quotes for their newspaper articles. They showed great reporter skills, writing newspaper reports for the Belleville Observer to inform others of the unwanted guest.



Year 5 had a super visit to the London Science Museum as part of their learning about forces and space this term. Pupils spent time exploring a space exhibit, before attending a 'feel the force' workshop after lunch. In the workshop, they were able to see a variety of forces put to the test in an interactive and practical way. Thank you to Mr Le Tissier for organising this great visit and for parents support in making it happen.

Pupils in 5B have enjoyed reading 'You Are Awesome' by Matthew Syed. They challenged themselves (with advice from the book itself) to develop their neural pathways and write letters of advice to a student who finds Maths difficult.

After dissecting a real lamb's heart last week, pupils in Year 6 have been consolidating their learning by finding out how blood travels through the body, known as the double circulatory system.



This week in PE, pupils have been inspired by the football World Cup and have been focussed on keeping control of a football while a defender is trying to put pressure on.
