Our Week – Early Years and Key Stage 1

Nursery are having a great second week and it's been wonderful seeing their personalities and confidence grow as they settle at BWA. Our highlight of the week has been seeing the pupils' creative thinking and inventive ways of using resources in their play. Particularly their use of the balance boards, which have been used as part of a 'river bridge' and a 'gate' on the bike tracks. Another special moment to mention is the travelling circus, which a group of pupils created together one afternoon. It is wonderful to see the pupils using their imagination and communication skills to work together.











This week in **Reception**, our pupils have been very busy in their Maths, Phonics, and Handwriting lessons. In Phonics, they have been learning the sounds s, a, t, and p, exploring how they can be used to blend. In Maths, pupils have been learning about matching and sorting in different ways and have enjoyed it very much. They all enjoy choosing time and love exploring the small world resources as well as sharing stories in the book corner.

During their English lessons, **Year 1** have been learning more about Julia Donaldson. Pupils enjoyed reading a range of Julia Donaldson's books and starting to identify the key features. They have learnt about repetition and rhyme and have worked hard to show they can identify these features in the books. Pupils really enjoyed acting out the story of *Room on the Broom* and used repeated phrases from the book, such as "I am a dog/cat/frog as keen





as can be, is there room on the broom for a dog/cat/frog like me?" We are looking forward to reading the sentences they will write using adjectives to describe each of the animals.

Our **1B** pupils have had a wonderful start to their first full English focus week. They were excited to discover that over the weekend, Fred the Bear went on his own adventure outside of school, complete with a bus ride, fishing and a trip to the shops. The class practiced sequencing events, before planning and writing a recount of all of Fred's antics. It was a great way to use their understanding of time words and sentence structure.

This week in Science, pupils in **Year 2** have been learning about food chains in Science. They explored how plants and animals depend on each other for survival and why every part of a food chain is important. Pupils enjoyed creating their own food chains, linking together producers, prey and predators, and discussing what might happen if one part of the chain was missing.

2B have had a fantastic, fun filled week with Miss Wilkes. They have been reading a new book called, On Sudden Hill, and recounting the story in their own words. In geography, they have been looking at the world around us, looking at continents and oceans. They have been remembering the continents of the world through song and then labelling them on a map.




Our Week - Key Stage 2

Year 3 has had a fabulous week. They particularly enjoyed delving into their Science topic, human anatomy. They used their knowledge of the human skeleton to create and label their own model.

This week, **3B** have been busy learning all about forces, specifically push and pull. Through hands-on activities, the pupils explored how different objects move and how forces can change their direction or speed. They had lots of fun sorting various actions and items into "push" and "pull" categories, deepening their understanding of how these forces work in everyday life.







In Geography, **Year 4** have been learning about North America and making comparisons between the Caribbean and the United Kingdom. They discovered that, especially with the weather, the Caribbean seems very appealing. The pupils have also learnt how to graph their findings and compare the two places carefully. They enjoyed using devices to research different cities and uncover interesting facts.

Year 5 took on the role of advice-givers, writing thoughtful letters in response to an anonymous author who asked for help mending a friendship they had damaged. Pupils gave consistent and heartfelt guidance, focusing on the importance of being true to yourself, showing kindness to everyone, and making good choices. Their advice highlighted the value of treating others with respect so that at the end of each day we feel happy that we have acted and cared for those around us as best we could.

This week, **Year 6** have been investigating the causes of World War Two. They were amazed by the number of their friends who have been reading about this topic at home: they had so much knowledge to share with the class. Pupils listened to the radio broadcast in which Neville Chamberlain declared war before ordering the events that led to the outbreak of war and analysing quotations from key historical figures.

6B have been diving into the exciting world of mixed operations and BIDMAS. They've been mastering how to solve problems that involve addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division all in one go, while applying the BIDMAS rule (Brackets, Indices, Division and Multiplication, Addition and Subtraction) to ensure they tackle each part of the equation in the correct order. Pupils have been engaging with fun challenges, strengthening their problem-solving skills and boosting their confidence in tackling more complex mathematical problems.
