# Our Week - Early Years and Key Stage 1

This week in **Nursery**, our pupils have been celebrating Diwali. They have been learning all about the Festival of Lights by making their very own paper lanterns to help Lord Rama find his way back home. The class have also enjoyed decorating their hands with beautiful Mehndi designs. Pupils have been getting taking part in Halloween-themed activities such as threading mummies and balancing spiders on webs, both of which also help develop their fine motor control.









This week in **Reception**, our pupils went on their very first trip. They went on a local area walk and ticked off what they could see. They also had lots of fun scooping out our class pumpkin.

To celebrate Diwali this week, **RB** read the story of Rama and Sita and discussed the Festival of Lights. Linking with the festival, the pupils made Diya lamps from clay. Although they found it difficult at first, by pinching and pushing the clay they were able to create their own Diya lamps. Once they are dry, the pupils will paint them.









This week, **Year 1** have really enjoyed their unit on Fred's Cafe. The pupils loved designing their own menus for Fred's Cafe and have done a fantastic job writing about the food on their menus. They have thought about including interesting adjectives to describe the food to make the menus as appetising as possible!



**Year 2** have started an exciting new topic all about multiplication. Pupils are focusing on learning the 2, 5, and 10 times tables, using lots of fun games and practical activities to help them spot patterns and make connections. They have been enthusiastic and are already showing great progress. They're really enjoying the challenge and can't wait to continue exploring multiplication in the coming weeks.



# Our Week - Key Stage 2

**Year 3** have had a fabulous week, also celebrating Diwali. They attended an assembly to learn more about Diwali and how it is celebrated across the world. The pupils also created their own Rangoli patterns, inspired by Diwali celebrations.





It's been a fantastic final week of the half term in

**Year 4 and 4B.** Pupils have been reflecting on everything they have learnt so far and celebrating how much they have achieved. In Science, they have been diving deep into the digestive system, discovering how their bodies break down food and use it for energy. To finish off their topic, they created double-page spreads to show everything they've learned. The pupils worked incredibly hard to include diagrams, key vocabulary, and fascinating facts about the journey food takes through their bodies – from the mouth all the way to the intestines.

**Year 5** have been consolidating their understanding of squared and cubed numbers. To support their learning, the children used manipulatives to explore these concepts practically - building the largest squares they could using square tiles and constructing impressive cubes with unifix cubes. It was a fun and hands-on way to bring their maths learning to life!

This week, **5B** have been learning about Ancient Greek Theatre, staging their own performances of The Minotaur and King Midas.

**Year 6** have been writing poetry inspired by the poet Karl Nova. Pupils have explored the theme of change by generating vocabulary to describe the four seasons, as well as writing about changes in their own lives. Here is one of the great poems written this week by Charlotte.
